

Strategy for the Development of International Relations EPS – Erasmus Policy Statement

The Technical University of Liberec defines its main in accordance with the policy of the Ministry of Education and the Bologna Process, TUL integration into the European Higher Education Area, the European Research Area and, in some fields, the research area at a global scale.

Internationalization, based on long-term supported activities, is carried out by TUL faculties and institutes and focused on education, research and development projects. TUL priority is to create mobility opportunities for the greatest percentage of quality students and academics and thus examine and enhance their ability to implement outcomes and increase their linguistic and professional competence.

TUL develops international cooperation with a number of universities and enterprises around the world to exploit synergies and complementarities that connect experts from different fields in the framework of inter-institutional agreements and sustainable cooperation and research projects. The volume of interdisciplinary cooperation with the business community at national and international level initiated the creation of the Center for Nanomaterials, Advanced Technology and Innovation.

The university focuses mainly on existing European cooperation and successful examples of joint and double degree programs. Some of the partnerships are directly conditioned by the geographical location of the university in the Euroregion Neisse (Czech Republic-Poland-Germany), resulting in University Nisa joint program a double degree in collaboration with HS Zittau-Gorlitz and the creation of the Academic Coordination Centre to promote the development of the euroregion.

Other cooperation activities are initiated within the frame of local authorities' partnerships (Liberec-St. Gallen) or on the basis of long term cooperation as it is the case the double degree program with the University of Paul Sabatier in Toulouse and the successful exchange programme with the University of Huddersfield, are also examples of TUL European partnerships.

The scope of international cooperation in research and education continues to increase, with the emphasis on the identification of key topics in basic applied research. The excellent cooperation with institutions in the USA, Canada and Japan are deepened and traditionally, Textile Engineering and Automobile Engineering study programs attract a number of international master students from Ukraine, India, South Africa, and other countries.

The Technical University of Liberec is dedicated to providing training and increasing the skills needed to work in an open international comprehensive environment for students, academics, researchers and other interested parties in higher education. The university will strive to improve the infrastructure for education related to research projects and will focus on the development of lifelong learning.

Teaching methods are improved for a more individual approach to students needs, enhancing the development of e-learning and modern educational tools and assuming the modularity of degree programs with all the implications for the organization of study. An Academic Advisory Board at TU Liberec seeks solutions to learning problems or obstacles, difficulties in career choice, relationship and personal distress, social problems, emergencies, etc...



Faculties are supported in their various international activities including active participation in international fairs and conferences promoting the recruitment of international experts and students, support in finding placements abroad for outgoing students and organization of lectures and seminars conducted by specialists from selected universities and enterprises.

The creativity of scientists reaching the international level of human is supported by an effective staff providing technical, organizational and administrative support. TUL approves the recruitment of managerial staff in charge of organizing the dissemination of new knowledge, methods and technologies to users, and possibly the whole of society.

TUL has launched a new marketing strategy to promote the university study programs, cooperation and research possibilities and to make information more accessible at national and international levels by improving the university electronic, social and printed media.

The implementation of Erasmus Program contributes to the development of the university by means of organizational compliance with the European Higher Education Area. Having obtained the ECTS and DS Labels, and succeeded in continuously increasing the number of mobilities and cooperation projects, the Technical University of Liberec expects to achieve higher quality standards by developing the profile of graduates to support their adaptability in relation to employers' requirements and improve their position in the labor market.

The operational objective is also to support the creative development of young researchers in the doctoral and postdoctoral stage of their professional development, especially by means of European and international contacts, publishing activities, involvement in solving challenging scientific projects and acquiring a wide range of soft skills important for the dissemination, practical and effective application of new knowledge in the business sphere and the popularization of achievements in science and research.
